Hi Steve,

I just spoke with Noel and confirmed that the excavator is for installation of the construction entrance for Lots 9 and 10 (it will be a T-shaped entrance that will serve both parcels). The entrance is a required erosion control measure and will help to minimize tracking of sediment into the street.

He will be excavating about 3" down for the aggregate entrance in order to stabilize the 1 foot thick rock bed made up of 4"-6" rock for use by trucks to enter and exit the site. We require confirmation of the installation of erosion control measures (including the construction entrance) prior to issuance of building permits. It is not part of the grading work subject to a grading permit hard card.

Noel's construction manager on this job is on vacation and he is having to do a lot of the running around to tie up loose ends, but says he will be able to get to the remaining items for issuance of the permits next week.

The Geotechnical reviews have been signed off for all 3 lots and the construction entrances are within the approved grading limits.

Three information requests as soon as possible:

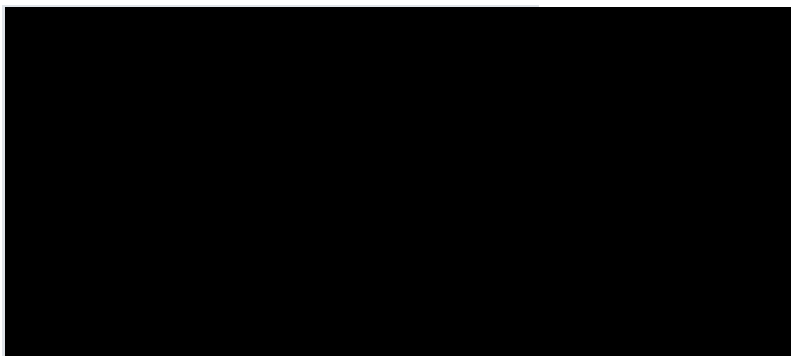
Please send a copy of the Building Permit.

Please send a current copy of the review of Storm Drainage Plan by Department of Public Works.

Please send the official County confirmation and supporting County engineering analysis and information used to verify that the proposed construction will not contribute to the instability of the parcel or adjoining lands and that all structural proposals including excavation, and proposed roads and other pavement have adequately compensated for adverse soil engineering characteristics and other subsurface conditions.

Hi Corrin,

That machine is probably needed to put in the construction entrance required for erosion control, which is required by the mitigation measures. The rocks will knock the dirt off the wheels of construction vehicles so that dirt is not tracked into the street. The erosion control measures must be installed prior to issuance of the building permits. There will be a construction entrance shared between Lots 9 and 10. There will also be one for Lot 11. They need to dig down a bit and put in the rock so it looks like the attached photo.
